I. WHAT IS ALEKS? WHY SHOULD I PREPARE BEFORE TAKING IT?

ALEKS is an adaptive computer-based placement test used to help determine which Math classes you are ready for at Kodiak College, UAA.

While preparation is **not** required, we do advise it because the higher you score, the fewer classes you'll have to take to reach your goals! *Note that the ALEKS practice modules are only available* after *you've completed your initial placement exam in ALEKS*.
